I strongly oppose the proposed "manufacturing decarbonization incentive" and other giveaways to oil and gas industry players who have long profited while burdening Californians with dirty air and rising energy costs. As currently designed, the program sets the emissions cap too high to meet California's climate goals or meaningfully improve air quality for the communities most harmed by pollution. These funds should instead be directed toward electricity bill credits for ratepayers and community investment programs that deliver cleaner air and water, safe housing, and accessible transit. I urge CARB to lower the emissions cap, eliminate or significantly reduce industry giveaways, and increase direct credits on electricity bills. Californians deserve a cap and invest program that actually invests in people — not polluters.
